FELT, in commerce, a fort of stuff deriving all its confistence merely from being sulled, or wrought with lees and size, without either spinning or weaving.

Felt is made either of wool alone, or of wool and hair. Those of French make,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  yards long, and  $1\frac{1}{2}$  broad, for cloaks, pay each 21. 148.  $1\frac{1}{160}$  d. on importation; and draw back 11. 128. 3 d. on exporting them again.
