BROACH, BROCHA, in Middle Age Writers, denotes an awi or bodkin. Among us broach is chiefly used for a steel instrument serving to open holes in metals. It is sometimes also applied to a stick on which thread or yarn is wound; and, in the North, to a fort of wooden needles used in kniting certain coarse things.
