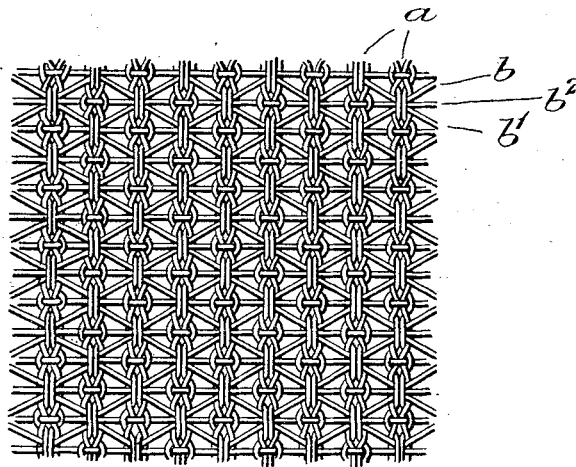
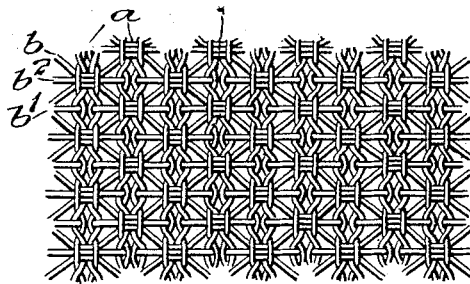

DESIGN FOR A HAMMOCK FABRIC.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 35,277, dated November 5, 1901.

Application filed October 4, 1901. Serial No. 77,607. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ISAAC E. PALMER, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Middletown, in the county of Middlesex and State of Connecticut, have invented a new and original Design for a Hammock Fabric, of which the following is a specification.

The essential feature of my design consists in a hammock fabric presenting warp-threads arranged in groups composed of pairs, the threads of each pair alternately separating from and approaching each other and the approaching and separating positions of the threads of one pair in a group alternating with the approaching and separating positions of another pair of the group, and the weft-threads being arranged in groups of three, the marginal members of the group alternately approaching and receding, while the central member of the group extends straight across the hammock fabric, the three mem-

bers of the group alternately interlocking with a group of warp-threads.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a face view of the hammock fabric, and Fig. 2 is a reverse view of the hammock fabric.

The groups of warp-threads are denoted by a , the marginal threads of the group of three weft-threads are denoted by $b b'$, and the central member of the group by b^2 .

What I claim is—

The design for a hammock fabric, substantially as herein shown and described.
